Do you like Indian Lore, learning more about OA inductions and ceremonies, and hanging out with new friends who have the same interests? Then you want to go to the National Order of the Arrow Indian Summer.

All Arrowmen interested in American Indian crafts and culture, and interested in expanding their skills and understanding of the Order's ceremonies are invited to participate in Indian Summer.

This event will elaborate and expand a participant's understanding of American Indian culture and set up the Arrowmen to learn even more. There will be hands-on experience with crafts, singing, dancing, Indian games, and conducting a powwow.

Do you need to improve your skills in conducting successful Call-Outs, Ordeal and Brotherhood and Vigil ceremonies? Then come to **Indian Summer** to delve deeper into the ceremony world of settings, props, symbolism, performing the ceremonies, the development of ceremonial costumes, understanding the ten induction principals, and administering the Ordeal.

The OA Indian Summer will be held near Asheville, N. Carolina, from August 1-6, 2011. The basic event fee is \$324, and round trip travel costs will be about \$150 per person. Registration must be made by the close of our Winter Banquet, and final payment of the event fee by Feb 28.
