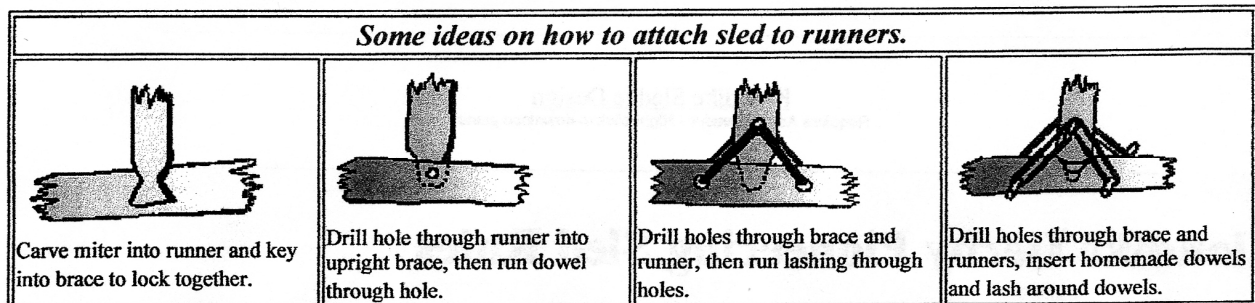


KLONDIKE DERBY PIONEERING SLED RULES

Approx. 6 foot by 2 foot sled (Sled MUST be at least 5' in length)

- I. Sled must be made entirely from small trees, brush, sticks and/or twigs. No lumber of any kind will be accepted, including machined dowels. The only prefabricated item allowed would be skis for the runners. Patrols should make arrangements to obtain their wood materials from the owner of the wooded area. The cutting of trees without the permission of the owner is forbidden by the Scout Law.
- II. Sleds may be of any design that meets the requirements of this sheet. If in doubt about your design, contact your Scoutmaster.
- III. All materials must be lashed, doweled (handmade), or dovetailed. No nails, screws, wire or glue should be used (the only exception is to attach the runners to the sled).
- IV. Adults are encouraged to supervise the building of these sleds, but the sled must be built entirely by members of the patrol or troop. A Scouter, as well as a Scout, is honest. Please give all the boys a chance to compete honestly. Any sled proven to be constructed by adults will be disqualified.
- V. Sleds should be constructed annually by the members of the patrol planning to compete. A sled may be used by the same patrol for more than one year under the following conditions:
 - i. The sled has been dismantled and reconstructed, making improvements.
 - ii. The sled in question has never been judged a winner of any trophy in a previous Klondike. Troops are encouraged to use winning sleds for display purposes only.
- VI. The use of drilled holes is accepted. Details fitted into these holes must be done by hand, such as handmade dowels.
- VII. Sleds that are being used in sled judging or sled race must compete in the field day competition. Sleds that fail to make it to all stations of the field day will be eliminated from other events.
- VIII. Troops and patrols are encouraged to make their sleds well in advance of the event, and time does not allow for construction of sled during the event. Note: Repairs or improvements may be made by members of the patrol at any time, provided these items do not interfere with rule number seven above.
- IX. The Scout riding on sled during the sled race MUST be of average size to the Scouts pulling the sled. Judges running the sled race may pick the member of the patrol who will ride on sled were they feel competition would be unfair to other patrols.
- X. The decisions of the judges on any event are final. Note: If members of a patrol feel they have been unfairly treated or if an honest mistake has been made, they should contact the chairman of the event immediately. All corrections must be made at the time they occur.
