Vigil Honor Nomination

The Vigil Honor is the highest honor that the Order of the Arrow can present its members for service to the lodge and/or council. It dates back to the year 1915, when OA's founder, E. Urner Goodman, became the first Vigil Honor member. Since then, thousands of members have been given this honor.

It is a high mark of distinction and recognition reserved for those Arrowmen who have given exceptional service, helping others beyond the call of duty involving personal effort and unselfish interest to one or more of the following: their lodge, the Order of the Arrow, their Council, Scouting, or their Scout camp. So, service in any of those areas would qualify a member for consideration. Under no circumstances should tenure in Scouting or the Order of the Arrow be considered as ample reason for a Vigil Honor recommendation.

Alertness to the needs of others is the mark of the Vigil Honor. This calls for an unusual awareness of the possibilities within each situation. Vigil Honor members have a time-honored tradition to uphold. As leaders, they must conduct themselves in accordance with the ideals of Scouting and the Order of the Arrow. Once an Arrowman has been Brotherhood for at least 2 years he or she may be considered for the Vigil honor by the Lodge members. Generally, only 2% of the Arrowmen in a Lodge will achieve Vigil in any year – simply put, one Vigil for every fifty members or part thereof.

The National Order of the Arrow Committee has stated it best that: "The Vigil Honor is a high mark of distinction and recognition reserved for those Arrowmen who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions beyond immediate responsibilities of their position or office to one or more of the following: their lodge, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting, or their Council Scout Camp."

While Brotherhood is a membership level you choose for yourself, the Vigil Honor is different. It is not appropriate to nominate yourself or a family member or ask others to nominate you. Doing so could adversely affect your consideration and selection. Others will nominate you by virtue of observing you and your hard work and service to the Lodge and Scouting. It's an honor that only can be bestowed upon you.

If you are looking to nominate someone for The Vigil Honor, **all nominations are due by May 1.** The eligibility list and nomination form are all available on the council website at bsacmc.org under the Order of the Arrow tab.

At Winter Fellowship Lonnie taught us how to make drums for our ceremonies, we had a great time bowling, we spent some valuable time together on the Archery & BB ranges, and we conducted an LEC meeting. The weekend was filled with lots of fun, brotherhood, and fellowship.



Lodge History



Read on to learn about our 2011 contingent to the Arrow Power event which was filled with service at the Superior National Forest.

Naguonabe had a wonderful contingent attending Section's Service on the Superior with the main goals of building mountain bike trails and repairing sections of the Superior Hiking Trail in the Grand Marais area of Minnesota. Scouts provided 454 hours of service. The first night there, a terrific storm blew over tents and everyone had to seek shelter, but the program went on the next day. The chief cook for the event served prime rib for the closing dinner. Yum!!!!! The scouts completed 900 feet of single track without features, 75 feet of bench-cut single track, 2,100 feet of single-track trail alignment on the mountain bike trails, 750 feet of boardwalk, 20 yards of gravel positioning, and 85 pieces of lumber positioning on the Superior hiking Trail. They also completed projects at the high school and community grounds. The community loved the scouts!
