Founders Award

Dr. E. Urner Goodman our founder, said the following in 1976

“The Spirt, as I understand it, is the real self of the individual helping himself to understand the world he lives in: helping to do what he thinks he ought to do in the future before him. It is a thing that is hard to set forth n so many words, but it is facing life we understand it and seeking guidance to do the right thing in life”

With that quote in the original “Spirt of Achievement” the Founders Award was approved by the National Order of the Arrow Committee in 1981.

The Founder’s awards, and national recognition, which can be given by Naguonabe Lodge to the individual or individuals who best memorize in their everyday Life the **spirit of achievement**. As revealed to us by the orders, founders E Urner Goodman in Colonel Carroll A Edson.

Nominees should demonstrate compassion, empathy, and concern for others in their daily life. It’s a way of life, not just a single act of kindness.

This award can be given to any member youth or adult or deal, brotherhood or vigil honor, and like the vigil honor one needs to be nominated for this award. There isn’t any particular form, but a letter, describing your nominee’s “Spirit of Achievement” needs to be turned into the lodge by **October 1, 2023** deadline or large quarter is two and we can select either two youth or one youth and one adult.

The award is a bronze medallion on a walnut base with the Founder’s likeness on one side and an inscription:

“For he who serves his fellows is of all his fellows, greatest”.

On the other side, a beautiful certificate accompanies the award. The recipient is also qualified to wear the universal OA pin suspended by a solid red ribbon.




